RABIES: A neighbor had to kill an aggressive squirrel in their yard. Be aware that rabies does occur in our area. Be wary of any wild mammal that shows no fear of humans, or is aggressive to humans. Get medical attention for any wild animal bite, no matter how minor it seems. As rabies can spread into domestic animals, get attention for any non-accidental pet bite, too. Rabies is deadly to humans if not treated early. Report any odd mammal behavior to York County Animal Control.
